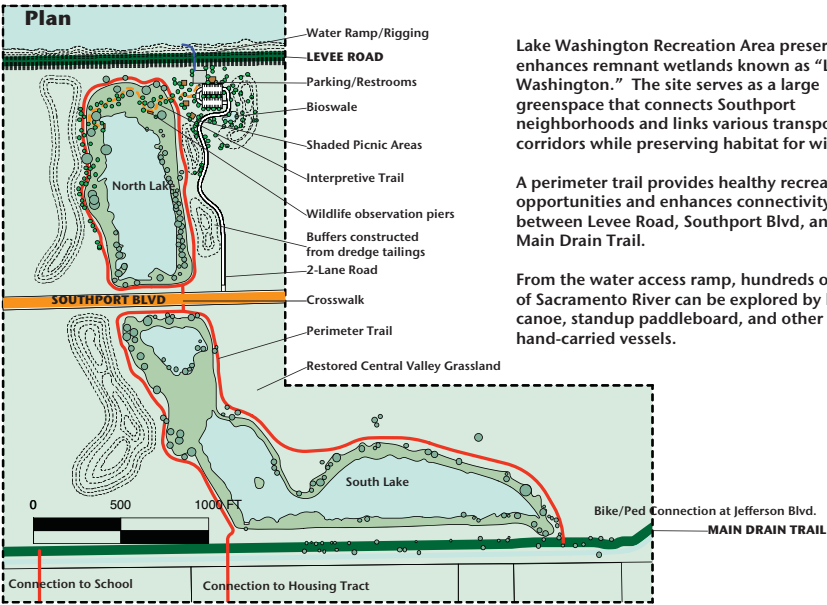

Perspective



Lake Washington Recreation Area preserves and enhances remnant wetlands known as "Lake Washington." The site serves as a large greenspace that connects Southport neighborhoods and links various transportation corridors while preserving habitat for wildlife.

A perimeter trail provides healthy recreational opportunities and enhances connectivity between Levee Road, Southport Blvd, and the Main Drain Trail.

From the water access ramp, hundreds of miles of Sacramento River can be explored by kayak, canoe, standup paddleboard, and other hand-carried vessels.

Perimeter Trail (Typical Section)



10'-0" wide, DG (decomposed granite) shared-use path

Trail runs around the perimeter of Lake Washington and will serve bicyclists and pedestrians.

Interpretive Trail (Typical Section)



4'-0" wide, DG path, (ADA accessible)

The interpretive trail is designed to educate the public on various features throughout Lake Washington Recreation Area.
